Changes to PWP's Energy Efficiency Partnering (EEP) Program

Effective January 1, 2014, Title 24 lighting standards will become even more stringent, as California continues to push for more efficient technology.

The EEP program is designed to reward customers who go above and beyond Title 24, when applicable. New construction and general lighting remodels that <u>exceed</u> the new Title 24 standards will continue to be eligible for PWP rebates, but projects that simply meet the new standards will not.

TITLE 24 EXEMPTIONS

The retrofits listed below are exempt from Title 24 requirements and <u>eligible</u> for EEP rebates:

- Lighting fixture upgrades or retrofits of up to 40 fixtures per location
- Lamp and ballast replacements
- Replacements using a fixture retrofit kit
- Reflector or optical system modifications
- Projects that involve 10 percent or less of the total fixtures in your facility

MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

Under the Title 24 changes effective in 2014, the lighting equipment listed below will now be mandatory for all new construction or major renovations and <u>will not be eligible</u> for EEP rebates, <u>unless</u> the equipment achieves energy savings beyond Title 24 standards. This includes:

- Occupancy Sensors
- Automatic Day- lighting Controls
- Energy Management System (EMS) for lighting
- Fluorescent T-12 light retrofits
